#### 90th Anniversary of Thornhill College



This year we are celebrating 90 years of Thornhill College on the Culmore Road.

There was an expansion of Thornhill buildings in the old school 1932 - 2003. Then we moved to the new school building.

Miss O'Hara reflects on some of the history of Thornhill.

As I walk around the school, I am reminded of various items which were in the old school building which shows a continuity between the old school and the new school. Thornhill College was founded by the Sisters of Mercy. Their Mercy Cross is shown on the entrance to the school and on the chairs in the oratory.

The two stain glass windows in the locker area "Art" and "Science" were part of the "New Block" built in the old school on the Culmore Road around 1933.

In the staffroom there is an abstract picture showing parts of the original school building, which was the stables owned by the Watt Family, the previous owners of the land at Thornhill. This picture was on the cover of the Thornhill Christmas Card in 1992.

The round blue stain glass window outside the boardroom is a reminder that the school colours used to be blue and yellow. There is a blue blazer and a blue and yellow scarf now in the Thornhill archives.

The statue of Our Lady in the foyer was presented by the Thornhill College Past Pupils Union and stood in the foyer of the old school.

Most of the past pupils highlighted in the Past Pupil Poster Corridor were pupils in the old school building.

In the boardroom are photographs of some of the former Principals of the old school. Near the locker area is a tapestry made to mark the Diamond Jubilee of the opening of Thornhill 1932 - 1992. It shows school buildings and a statue of the Our lady which is in the convent grounds.

The Thornhill College Year Book is on the Thornhill website. You can read the history of the school in one of the articles.

There are several aspects of school life which have continued seamlessly from the old school to the new school: the school motto "Adventiat Regnum Tuum" on the school blazer, the School Song, and most important, the friendliness of the pupils and staff. In September 2023 we will mark twenty years of life in the new school building, but that is a story for another day, as they say.
